ATTORNEY GENERAL MARK L. SHURTLEFF

Mark L. Shurtleff was elected as the Utah Attorney General in November 2000. Before that, he served as the Chairman of the Salt Lake County Commission.

Shurtleff was born and raised in Utah, graduating from Brighton High School, Brigham Young University and the University of Utah School of Law.

He served in the U.S. Navy Judge Advocate General (JAG) Corps as an Officer and Attorney, prosecuting hundreds of cases from 1985 to 1990. Shurtleff was a private practice trial lawyer in California from 1990 to 1993. He returned to Utah to serve as an Assistant Attorney General from 1993 to 1997. From 1997 to 1998, he was a Deputy County Attorney for Salt Lake County.

Shurtleff was a Small Claims Judge Pro Tem in the Third District Court and a law enforcement and corrections instructor. He sits on the Executive Committee for the Conference of Western Attorneys General and serves on the Board of Directors of the National Commission Against Drunk Driving, the International Association of Prosecutors, and the Washington Legal Foundation. Locally, he serves on the Boards of the Rape Recovery Center, Peace Officer Standard and Training, Constitutional Defense Council, Utah Coalition Against Pornography, the Commission on Criminal & Juvenile Justice and is the Chairman of the Utah Prosecution Council.

Mentoring and volunteerism have been a major part of Shurtleff's life. He has been a Boy Scout leader for 22 years. He is an anti-drug lecturer in our schools, an At-Risk Youth Mentor and a basketball, soccer, volleyball and softball coach. He is currently the Honorary Chair of the Utah Mentor Network and personally mentors two elementary students.

His interests include history, literature, writing, international relations, politics, and cooking. He recently took up the extreme sport of skydiving. Shurtleff also speaks, reads and writes Spanish.

Most importantly, he and his wife, M'Liss, have been married for 23 years and are the parents of five beautiful children between the ages of 20 and 6.
